Astronomy and Space Club

The Astronomy and Space Club at Legae Academy had an exciting and enriching term, highlighted by a remarkable opportunity to meet the European Space Agency Astronaut Professor Christer Fuglesang. This event took place on October 2, 2024, at the University of Botswana (UB) and marked the official launch of the Centre of Excellence in Planetary, Space, and Technology (CESST), developed by the UB FAST4Future team.

Professor Fuglesang's visit was a pivotal moment for our club, providing students and teachers with firsthand insights into space exploration. Eleven enthusiastic students and four Physics teachers represented Legae Academy at this unique event.

The two-hour session included a captivating presentation by Professor Fuglesang, who shared his experiences from two missions to the International Space Station (ISS). His engaging talk was enhanced by videos showcasing his journey, daily life in space, and his research endeavors.

Students gained valuable knowledge about the future of Astronomy and its applications across various scientific disciplines, including Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Engineering, Medicine, and Computer Science, with a particular emphasis on AI. The interaction not only inspired our students but also deepened their understanding of how space exploration influences multiple fields. The meeting with Professor Fuglesang was a resounding success, igniting a passion for space science among our members.



One of our Form 5 students VAISHNAV SUBEESH KOLAZHY participated in a panel discussion during the National Science week from 19 August 2024 to 23 August 2024, organised by the Ministry of Communications, Knowledge and Technology in collaboration with BIUST and with the involvement of other stakeholders.

The discussion was entitled "What are the advantages and disadvantages of Artificial Intelligence in Secondary School Education"

The panel discussion took place on the 20th of August 2024 at Mafitlhakgosi Primary School.

Field Trip to the Meteorological Department

On the 17th of September 2024, 59 Form 5 students embarked on a field trip to the Meteorological Department Centre located in Village, Gaborone. The students were accompanied by Ms Ndaramwi and Mr Kezhara. They left the school at 7:20 and were back in school by 10:00 am. This was an educational trip meant to enhance students' knowledge of the interpretation of weather elements and instruments. Students got the opportunity to enter the weather room where the weather news is broadcast nationwide and viewed on television and other media platforms. They also had hands-on experience in the weather station as they observed and interacted with real time weather instruments. They saw a Stevenson Screen and all the instruments kept in it as well as a sunshine recorder, wind vane, rain gauge and other automated instruments. Above all, they learnt data literacy as they were taught how to collect, analyse and interpret data. Finally, the students passed by the Three Chiefs Monument in the CBD, thereby enriching their knowledge of the political geography of Botswana. Overall, the trip truly gave the Form 5 geography students a cloud nine learning experience.

Chess Club

The main competition within the Club, held during October, was the annual Handicap Knockout Tournament in which the stronger players had to give odds of pieces to weaker players. This was won by Ezra Bartlett (2C) who defeated his strongest rival, Hariharan Ananda (1C), in the final. The losing semi-finalists were Noor Fatima Toor (1B) and Deon Martin (2C). Also receiving awards for defeating much higher seeded players were Michael Ketlhokile (2D and Yuhao Wu (2C). Altogether 16 players competed in this tournament.

Legae Academy players competed in 3 external tournaments.

The first of these, held at Botho University over the weekend 7-8th September, saw Hasitha Manikonda (4F) win a trophy and gold medal for finishing in 1st position in the Girls Senior Section with a score of 4.5 points from 7 games. Ezra Bartlett won a silver medal for his performance in the Boys Junior event, scoring 5 points from 7 games. Other competing Legae players were Hariharan Ananda (4.5/7), Rishitha Mallavaram (3/7), Ulathi Nkomo (4/7) and Samuel Mukisa (3/7).

There was further success for our players at the Primavera Chess Tournament held at UB on 16th September. Awards were gained by three students as follows:

Deon Martin (2C) - Gold medal and chess set for 1st position in the Boys U12 Section,

Hariharan Ananda (1C) – Gold medal and chess set for 1st position in the Boys U-14 Section.

Ulathi Nkomo (2C) – Bronze medal for 3rd position in the Boys U14 Section

Other students competing in this event were Ezra Bartlett (2 points from 5 games), Rishitha Mallavaram (3/6), Noor Fatima Toor (1/6), Hasitha Manikonda (3/6), Samuel Mukisa (2/5) and Ritvik Sayana.

In the final event of the year, nine of our players competed in the 3rd Youth & Cadets Chess Championships held at The Learning Center from 26-27th October. Hasitha Manikonda again won a gold medal and trophy for finishing 1st in the Girls Open event with a perfect score of 6 wins from 6 games. Ezra Bartlett won a bronze medal by finishing 3rd in the Boys Open scoring 5 points from 6 games. Also winning a bronze medal was Samuel Mukisa with 6 points from 7 games in the Boys U-12 event. Other results by Legae Academy players were as follows:

Rishitha Mallavaram (2C) – 5th position in Girls Open scoring 3 points from 6 games.

Noor Fatima Toor (1B) – 12th position in Girls Open (2/6).

Hariharan Ananda (1C) – 12th position in Boys Open (4/6).

Ulathi Nkomo (2C) – 26th position in Boys Open (3/6).

Yuhao Wu (2C) – 33rd position in Boys Open (2/6).

Deon Martin (2C) – 38th position in Boys Open (2/6).

It is hoped that next year the Club will continue to build upon its success as the top-ranking school among all private schools in Botswana and be able to increase its membership to return to the numbers seen in previous years.
