We will be holding consultation with parents mainly to discuss the academic performance of their children in the second term.

Needless to say- this is an opportunity that parents cannot afford to miss.

2026 Fees Structure

After a careful consideration of rising costs and the recent devaluation of Pula, the Board of Governors of Legae Academy had no option but to increase the school fees for 2026 by a minimum possible percentage (6.5% for secondary school and 6% for A-Level). This will just allow for the school to meet the additional costs, incurred due to inflation and adjustment of the salaries of our staff.

Form1 to Form 4: P93,900.00 p.a. (P31,300.00 per term)

Form 5: P93,900.00 p.a. (P46,950.00 to be paid in two instalments at the beginning of Term 1 and Term 2)

AS and A2: P110,000.00 p.a. (P55,000.00 payable in two instalments at the beginning of Term land Term 2).

Parents, who wish to make the fee payment in different instalments should please contact the Assistant Bursar (aa.nkwe@legaeacademy.co.bw).

Deadline for the payment of fees for each term is Wednesday before the school term begins.

Discount for a single payment: The parents who can pay next year's entire fee (annual fee) this year by 10th of November 2025 will be exempted from paying the increased fee for next year. It means that you pay only 2025 fees for 2026 academic year. Please note that the payment has to made in lump sum and one receipt will be issued after this year's third term fees have been cleared.

Discount for Siblings: 5% discount will be offered to the third sibling enrolled at Legae academy while other two siblings are still students here and 10% discount will be granted to the fourth sibling. Once, one of the siblings graduates from the school or leaves the school, concession will be adjusted accordingly.
